Hi - I wanted to provide input on the visualizations that the County has recently released. I like Visualization B the best because it retains the "Tri-Valley" (Pleasanton, Livermore and Dublin) together in one district, which Visualization A does not do. As I mentioned in my prior submitted comments, the Tri-Valley is my community, even though I live in Livermore. My family and I shop, go to parks, work, meet our friends, see our doctors, get other services, etc. from Pleasanton and Dublin, almost interchangeably with Livermore resources.

And Visualization B makes more sense than Visualization C because the former includes areas outside the Tri-Valley that have more in common with it - i.e., Sunol and Castro Valley; these are communities are more like the Tri-Valley than Fremont (parts of which Visualization C includes). Sunol and Castro Valley are smaller, more rural communities, like Livermore. In terms of geography, Sunol and Castro Valley are more proximate than Fremont with the Tri-Valley because of the natural geography - going over the Sunol grade to get to Fremont feels like a daunting task, in large part because of traffic, and feels much farther away than would be apparent on the map. Fremont and Livermore do not have much in common, in my opinion.
